

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MMS Focus & Philosophy

The focus at MMS is on a Christ-centered education; one where the morals and mission of Jesus Christ take on living form through the teachers and staff, not merely religious rhetoric unsubstantiated by actions.

Our Philosophy of education is to create an educationally balanced, Christ-centered, play based learning environment where the focus is on discovering each child's unique gifts, talents, and learning style. Implementing this focus should, in turn, develop students with a love of learning, and a deeper understanding of themselves and their Creator.

Our commitment, as teachers and staff, to you, the families of MMS, is that we will seek to apply this philosophy of education by:

- Seeking the Lord's wisdom above all else, and loving Him with our whole heart, soul, and mind.
- Striving to build within our students a character that is Christ-centered in nature.
- Developing and maintaining a posture of active listening, which will aid and foster learning.
- To teach accurately and thoroughly the core subjects of: Bible, Character building, Language arts, English Literature, Math, History, Geography, Science, Environmental responsibility, Safety, Physical Education, Art, Cultural Studies, and Foreign Language.
- To model to our children the acts of being responsible, resourceful, and respectful to one another.
- To always be aware and sensitive to the various learning styles of our children and teach, when possible, in the format they understand best.
- To provide tools and practical life experience to enrich and develop a lifelong curiosity and love of learning.

Role of the Parent/Guardians

Just as the teachers are prepared to make a commitment to your family, we ask that you prayerfully and respectfully review this handbook and sign the signature page located in your Brightwheel App. Please know that every guideline is one that furthers the education experience of your child. We believe that you are your child's first teacher, and that no one knows your child more than you do! We would be remiss if we did not take advantage of the wealth of information and dedication that our families have for their children. While you will be asked to volunteer some of your time, you will also be asked for your input and suggestions to improve and grow our school.

MMS Curriculums

At the Montreat Morning School we use a variety of educational theories and philosophies. Most of our student's day is broken into two main curriculums; developmentally appropriate play based and academic. However, we also use some emergent curriculums using the child's interest to guide and drive the day's events. We are blessed by the beauty of Montreat every day, taking a group of student's on a nature walk and studying the activities of a tadpole in the lake or bugs on a tree trunk makes room for endless conversation, class wide learning projects, and beautiful art pieces.

Through our emphasis on **developmentally appropriate play based** philosophies, we promote our students to participate in age appropriate activities, such as unstructured hands on play, group story time, or themed activities. Our students are encouraged to learn through play. We believe that children have a natural curiosity to the world around them. Our job as preschool educators is to provide a safe, interactive, and imaginative world for our students where learning through their environment is encouraged and valued.

In addition to emergent and play based approaches, we also value academic approaches. Certain times of a student's day are structured more academically where teachers are leading students through a planned activity. This could be through learning shapes and colors in our two year old class moving towards letter and number recognition in our three year old class to finally putting letter sounds together to begin the initial stages of reading in our Pre K and TK classes. Beginning in 2022, we are implementing Heggerty's phonemic awareness curriculums in our Pre K and TK classes.

Role of the Teacher

Beyond the implementation of the MMS Philosophy, our teachers and staff are committed to being:

- An example: modeling peaceful and respectful behavior and words to one another, students, and parents. The teacher creates the environment where ground rules allow the student to flourish.
- Proactive: watching the children as they explore the works and materials around them, and creating a teachable moment that resonates with the child's individual needs.
- Observer and Recorder: making notes of the child's progress and changes as his/her education progresses.
- *Innovator*: changing the materials and workspaces to emphasize new units of study, and to re-energize the classroom.
- Active listener: allowing the children the freedom to express and explain themselves, their interest and their motivations.
- *Communicator*: attempting through conversations, invitation, newsletter and announcement to include and inform parents of events within the classroom.
- *Loving*: the MMS Staff love your children!

Encouraging Positive Behavior

Children often learn by watching and practicing positive interactions. They learn to take responsibility for their own actions and begin to make choices concerning their behavior. Taking these beliefs into consideration, Montreat Morning School employs the following forms of teaching/modeling positive behavior:

- Teachers create boundaries for the children, which allow them to consider their actions before misbehaving.
- Teachers model appropriate behavior and speech with the children, each other and parents.
- Teachers encourage active listening and peaceful conflict resolution; giving each child opportunities to speak and share the reasoning behind his/her behavior.
- Teachers are prepared to modify the classroom at any time if they see that a certain work or item is causing a stumbling block to proper behavior.
- Teachers are adept at offering choices which gives the child an active and responsible role in his/her school day. We reserve "mandates" and "must do's" for safety issues, primarily.
- We are committed to treating the child as a person and respect his/her needs and feelings, even if we don't agree with him/her. We may have to listen attentively and still say that his/her idea will not work within the classroom... but we will hear him/her out completely and respectfully.
- We will utilize REDIRECTION to distract a child who is focused on a behavior that is not conducive to a classroom setting. We will use short periods of time away from others for the child to rest and regroup if needed to get over a "hump" of inappropriate behavior. We are determined to stay consistent with our boundaries to prevent confusion to the child.

In some rare circumstances we may have a situation where a child must be removed from the classroom setting because of persistently dangerous or harmful behavior. In this situation, the child will sit with the MMS Director until they are willing to discuss their behavior or a parent is called.

Financial Arrangements & Tuition Payments

• Tuition is based on a September – May school year. Tuition payments must be set up on automatic drafts from your bank account or via debit/ credit card through your Brightwheel App. (see the office for assistance on logging into your account). Your first month's tuition is due by August 15th, 2023. Beginning October 1st, tuition is due the FIRST OF EACH MONTH. If payment is not received by the 10th of each month, there is a delinquent charge of \$30 added to the monthly tuition payment. There will be a \$25.00 service charge on all returned payments. Automatic payments will go through on the 1st of each month. If the 1st falls on a holiday or weekend, it will be drafted (or due) on the preceding business day. You may also pay by a cash or check in the MMS Office. If your tuition checks fall behind more than 30 days, and no arrangements or payment plan have been arranged with the school, the parents may be asked to withdraw their child/children. Application/Registration/Activity fees are not refundable.

Enrollment for returning MMS families for the 2024–2025 school year will begin in February of 2024. Open enrollment for the public will begin in March of 2024. You will be required to pay the enrollment fee of \$150 to secure your child's place for the upcoming school year.

*Please be prepared to make your \$150 enrollment fee in February 2024 when you re-enroll. Class space is tight with our enrollment. The enrollment fee is the only way to ensure your child's placement is saved for the following school year.

Late Pick ups and Late Fees

ALL LATE FEES begin at 12:30pm.

A late fee of \$1.00 per minute past 12:30pm will be charged to your account up to 10 minutes (\$10.00). After 12:30pm, you will need to send a message through the Brightwheel App or call the MMS office to have your child brought to the first floor lobby for pick up. If you have not contacted us by this time, we will attempt to contact those listed on the approved pick up list. It is our hope that you are "en route" and will safely arrive to pick up your child(ren) soon.

After the first 10 minutes, the office will begin to charge a flat \$10 for the next 11-20 minutes and so on in \$10/10 minute increments. Failure to pay the charge will result in suspension from all programs until this fee is paid. You will receive a late fee invoice the following day. Payment of this invoice must be received by the MMS office by the end of the week.

MMS + You = Great Things

Detailed information on topics below will be provided via the Virtual Parent Orientation and will be included in the Welcome Packs during your first week of school.

Volunteering and Substituting

We are bringing back volunteers! We ask each family to volunteer 10 hours per school year in support of your child's classroom. Opportunities to sign up will be provided at the beginning and throughout the school year.

We have a full time floater this year to, first and foremost, act as a substitute when a teacher is out. However, we expect there will be times when additional support is needed. Substitutes are on a paid basis. We offer a required orientation for those interested. The purpose of this orientation is to share information concerning daily schedules and procedures as well as to collect the proper information on all adults serving in your child's classroom. Please notify the MMS office if you are interested and we will provide you with all needed forms.

Daily Schedules, Teaching & Preparing for a Successful Year

Each day brings new adventure into the life of a child. We will provide you with a sample of each age group's daily activities and curriculum in their welcome packets and via our website. We will also provide you with a list of ideas and information to prepare your child for a great start to this upcoming year!

MMS Tote Bags

We are pleased to offer each first time MMS student enrolled in the 2022–2023 School Year a Montreat Morning School Tote Bag. These bags should be used to bring items to and from your house each day. The bags are not required but are a safer option than plastic grocery bags. The 2 year olds and 3 year olds have limited space in their cubbies/hooks. They will hang their tote bags on the hooks in the hallway.


For PreK/TK- if you choose to bring other bags/or bags in addition to the provided tote bag, we ask that all items fit neatly on a hook. For safety reasons, we will not be able to house items on the hallway or classroom floor that do not fit on the hooks properly.

For returning students who would like to order a new bag, you can order one for a charge of \$10. Please contact the office to order.

Please do not allow your child to bring any personal items from home, i.e.: stuffed animals, dress up, toys, jewelry, pacifiers, etc.

SAME ROUTINE FROM PREVIOUS YEAR

Morning Drop Off will only be offered through the car line this year and will begin on the 1st day of school. Please refer to the carline map that has been provided to you. Morning drop off begins at 8:15am and ends at 8:30am

If you arrive after 8:30am, you will need to park in front of the MMS (the Henry Building) and walk your child into the school building. You can either call the MMS office, message via Brightwheel, or use the intercom to be let in.

We also will now be requiring all approved pick up and drop off individuals to enter a 4 digit code to check-in/check-out a student. This code can be set up and changed in your Brightwheel app. See the office for assistance if needed.


Afternoon Pick Up also takes place via our carline. Afternoon Pick Up begins at 12:15pm and ends at 12:30pm

1. During regular pick-up times, an MMS Staff member will stand outside and radio classrooms as families arrive for pick-up.

• Shared teachers will escort children to their family waiting outside/in their car.

2.If a family wishes to pick up before the scheduled pick-up time, they can send a message through the Brightwheel App or call the office to let them know they are there to pick-up.



Need Based Scholarships

From time to time we all run into periods of financial hardship. Whatever your situation, we are here for you and your children. Please contact the MMS office or MMS Director to confidentially inquire about any funds that may be available and/or volunteer options for a % of tuition discount. These are extremely limited and are strictly need based.

The financial aid application including your most recent tax documents, must be complete, to include the W2 forms prior to any awarding of assistance. Applications are available upon request and award letters will be sent no late than July 15th.

It is expected that any child receiving financial assistance participate/attend at least 90% of the enrolled days each month. The only exception of this would be illness or emergency.

The MMS reserves the right to decrease the %, or remove scholarships based on the availability of the funding.

We ask that those receiving financial assistance as well as our other parents attending the MMS (without scholarship) agree to volunteer for our school and/or related activities a minimum of 10 hours per year.

MMS Policies

Placement of Students and Registration & Transition Kindergarten Class (Transition TO Kindergarten)

- MMS places students according to age but reserves the right to interview a child to determine academic or social readiness for placement. Parents can also request an assessment of their child's progress. The PreK and TK classroom are both kindergarten preparatory. Students are expected to attend a full school year. Like most PreK/TK programs, we are aligning our academics to a M -F (5 day) program.
- Registration for returning families and siblings of current students will be in February. New student registration will begin in March. There is a \$150.00 enrollment fee for both new and • returning students. Once paid, this fee guarantees placement for your child and later is considered your child's consumable fee. These fees will cover the cost of bringing "field trip" style activities/events to our center throughout the year and enrollment costs. This fee is non-refundable.

Insurance


• We recommend that you carry your own medical and accident insurance on your child(ren). MMS does carry Nursery School Accident Protection Program Insurance. The policy is \$5.50 per child with a maximum medical benefit of \$25,000.00 accidental death and dismemberment of \$10,000.00 with a \$25 deductible. The cost for this is included in your tuition and is primary coverage insurance.

Withdrawal Notifications

• Families needing to withdraw their child from the Montreat Morning School must provide the school office with a 30 Day Advance WRITTEN notification of withdrawal. We will accept email, Brightwheel, or handwritten notices. We do not accept text notification, messages via social media, or in-person conversations as formally withdrawing your student. It is also asked that withdrawal notifications come from the parent/guardian of the child. Notifications from a grandparent or other paying party-will not allow us to make changes to a child's enrollment status.

Current monthly tuition and fees are not prorated or refundable.

MMS Policies Continued

Transitional Kindergarten Class (Transition TO Kindergarten)

Started in 2015, the MMS opened a Transitional Kindergarten Classroom that provides an additional setting where younger five -year-olds can thrive and have the gift of time to develop in accordance with their natural pace. MMS admits children to this program "who would benefit from an additional year of growth- be it for academic, social/emotional or birth-age before entering Kindergarten." Therefore, it is the policy for transitional kindergarten students to turn five between August 31st and December 31st or have completed the PreK classroom the year before. The class size for TK classroom is set at a maximum number of 15 students.

*If there are families that desire for their child to proceed to first grade from the MMS TK Classroom - it is their responsibility to register as a homeschool program and follow the path of the NC Standards for Kindergarten and/or other academic requirements.

**The MMS TK Classroom is Kindergarten Preparatory and a "more formalized" extension of the PreK program offered at MMS, while still observing the importance of learning through play-based thematic lessons.

Entrance Requirements


Our students span the age of 12 months to TK (usually 5 ½ old.) Children will be placed in classes based on the age they will be as of August 31st. Parents will need to fill out and return their registration form, medical facts, and emergency forms PRIOR to the first day of school. Children in the PreK/ TK class must be proficient in the toilet routine.

We require each child to have on file either their immunization records from their pediatrician/health dept. or a religious medical exemption form. If your child has an allergy or dietary restriction we ask that you have your pediatrician fill out the Allergy/Medical Action Plan.

We will adhere to all Allergy Action plans signed by your child's pediatrician- and will accommodate any child's needs as you navigate and discover new allergies. We hope that allergies are not discovered, but if so, communication between parent, teacher/office, and your child's medical professional is important. If you need an Allergy Action plan, please contact our office.

Health and Sickness Policy

MMS will strive to make every effort possible to protect the health and safety of our students. All of our staff are Red Cross CPR & First Aid Certified, and trained in Pediatric Defibrillation. Please help lessen the spread of infectious and communicable illnesses by keeping a sick child home. Using the Center of Disease Control (CDC) supported guidelines;

We will call you to come pick up your child if we find that they have any of the symptoms listed below:

- If he/she has a fever of or over <u>100.4 degrees</u> Fahrenheit
- If there have been any episodes of vomiting or diarrhea in the previous 24 hour period
- If he/she demonstrates any symptoms of a communicable disease such as: lice, impetigo, pink eye, strep throat, chicken pox or whooping cough etc.

If your child has <u>2 or more</u> symptoms listed below (but not limited to) we will call you to come pick your child:

- If there is a consistent cough
- If he/she demonstrates fatigue, crankiness or lethargy
- If there is yellow or green nasal discharge
- If the he/she is complaining of not feeling well or demonstrating behavior than is unusual
- If he/she is on an antibiotic, wait at least <u>48 hours</u> from first dose

If we contact you to come and pick up your child due to illness, you must arrange for pickup within <u>30 minutes</u> of notification. Please call if your child has been absent for more than three days or has a contagious illness.

Medication should be administered at home. The only exception is asthma inhalers and EPI pens. MMS WILL NOT administer medication, sunscreen, or bug spray. In the case of an injury beyond the occasional scrape or bump, we will make an immediate attempt to contact a parent. If we are unsuccessful, we will proceed to call the listed Emergency Contact number, and if necessary, we will call the child's physician and/or the ambulance. Incident reports will be filled out promptly via Brightwheel.

It is imperative that your emergency numbers are kept current and up to date. Please provide us with written or email documentation of all chances to this information.

Tuition credits are not issued for short-term illnesses nor can days missed be traded for attending alternate dates.





Special COVID-19 Addendum

The health and well-being of our families and staff are our highest priorities. In the interest of limiting the opportunity for transmission to our vulnerable community, we are taking the following precautionary measures:

We will now require approved drop-off individuals to complete a brief health screening questionnaire via Brightwheel each morning before the child can enter the school. Should you or any household member have any of the following symptoms, we ask you to remain out that day and notify the school: • Fever of 100.4 or higher, now or in the preceding 24 hours (or would have, but have used fever reducing medicine)

- <u>New Cough</u>
- <u>Sore Throat</u>
- Muscle Aches
- <u>Difficulty Breathing</u>
- <u>New Loss of Taste or Smell</u>

Consistent with our COVID-19 Policy, the household will be required to remain out of the center for 10 days unless medical clearance is provided by a physician indicating that the presenting symptoms are associated with a known non-COVID-19 illness. The physician's note must not be from a family member.

Exclusion from the school is sometimes necessary to reduce the transmission of illness. For your child's comfort, and to reduce the risk of contagion, we ask that children be picked up within 30 minutes of notification. Until then, your child will be kept comfortable and will continue to be observed for symptoms.

Confirmed COVID-19 Exposure

• At this time, we do not exclude for COVID-19 exposure, only symptoms and/or positive tests. Please note, depending on the circumstances we may require you to obtain medical clearance before return to the center will be allowed. This policy is subject to change at any time and you will be notified of the changes as they occur.

It is your responsibility to inform Montreat Morning School immediately if anyone in your household has tested positive for COVID-19. We urge you to be diligent in practicing the CDC's recommendations of regular hand washing with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds, using hand sanitizer with 60% or greater alcohol content when soap and water is not available, maintaining at least 6 feet distance between you and those outside of your household, wearing face coverings when social distancing is not possible, and staying home if anyone in your household does not feel well. Following these guidelines will not only help to reduce your family's risk of illness but will help to protect over 100 children and staff members at Montreat Morning School that your child may be in contact with.

there is a confirmed case at MMS:

1. If a child or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, our Local Health Department will be notified immediately and the infected person may not return until proper documentation is provided by a medical provider stating they have followed required protocol for recovery and are well to return.

2. Classes will not be closed for exposure. However, if there is a confirmed case in your child's class, you will be notified of the exposure.


3. If a child begins to feel unwell after they have been dropped off at school and is found to have a temperature of 100.4 degrees or above, taken with our infrared non-contact thermometer, parents will be notified and asked to pick up their pick-up, to help mitigate exposure of any illness to other students and our staff. During any outbreak of illness we will increase our sensitivity to these safety precautions to protect children in our care as well as our staff.

4. Children who test positive will be excluded for 10 days, with the 1st day of symptoms being day 0. Adults who test positive will be excluded 5 days and be required to mask for an additional 5 days.

Clothing

Please dress your child in comfortable, washable play clothes and shoes. Please no flip flops or sandals without back straps. We ask that you do not send your child to school in clothing or shoes that will limit their ability to quickly maneuver steps, slides, climbing or running. We also ask; in an effort to prevent "potty" related accidents, you consider your child's ability to remove/replace their clothing quickly for using the restroom.

We ask that each child have one COMPLETE set of clothing (including undergarments, socks, and shoes) in their MMS Tote Bag or cubbie at ALL TIMES. We will send out reminders when the season changes so you can "update" the style of clothing.

For those children in the "potty training" process, we ask that you:

- Keep extra diapers/pull-ups in your child's cubby.
- Keep two sets of clothes (including socks and shoes)
- Make sure their clothing is manageable for them...not the adult.

Inclement Weather

To preserve the rhythm in our student's lives we will make every effort to stay open during the snowy season, however; we must take into consideration the many families and staff that may live at higher elevations and travel remains risky for them long after roads in town look suitable or have been cleared. We will use several resources to make our decision and ultimately following Buncombe County Schools Owen district decision.

You will be notified of school closings via Montreat Morning School Facebook Page and Brightwheel notification.

Please be aware that a NOTIFICATION of a DELAY may actually turn into a CLOSING. Please double check your sources before venturing out for a school day.

If we have a weather situation where we need to close school early, while our day is in operation; you will be informed via the same methods as above and/or personal calls from your child's teacher, MMS Staff, or CCCM office personnel. You will be given a scheduled "closing time" and late pick up fees will apply. It is our goal to provide the safest environment possible for our children as well as our staff. We ask for your consideration and promptness.

We do not refund monthly-tuition based on snow days or school delays.

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Snacks & Birthday's

During the first week of school, your student's teacher will ask you to sign up for up to <u>4 weeks out of the school year</u> to provide snacks for your child's class. The week before your selected week, you will be receiving a Brightwheel message or hard copy list of the suggested snack items for the particular class. Please talk with your child's teacher concerning WHEN they need you to deliver the items. The TK and 1 Year Old Classroom will handle snacks differently than the rest of the classrooms and will be addressed in a separate letter.

Birthdays are an exciting time for EVERYONE! If you would like to send in a special treat to school on your child's birthday, please do! It will be helpful for your child's teacher to know in advance what you would like to do so that they can be accommodating with their teaching schedule. The teacher will also need to provide you with any food limitations or restrictions in the classroom. We want everyone to be able to participate on these extra special occasions. Please consider mini cupcakes and snack sized options rather than full sized desserts. Summertime birthdays will not be overlooked! We will gladly hold a special day closer to the end of school to celebrate your child. These parties will need to be scheduled by classroom, so be sure to check with your child's teacher prior to April.



Communication



MMS takes great pride in protecting your child from adverse effects of allergens. With great amount of prayer and consultation we have purposed to be able to accommodate the following allergies:





Gluten/Wheat Dairy Egg **Peanuts**

Please note: As of 2010 we have been a PEANUT-FREE School. This means peanuts, peanut products, and any/all foods containing PEANUTS (or PEANUT PRODUCTS). This does not require you to search out food labeled as, "not produced on machinery processing peanuts" or the like.

<u>We are SERIOUS about protecting ALL of the students in our care</u>. When you sign up for your weeks of snack provision, your child's teacher will give you a suggested snack list that reflects foods that are safe for the individuals in that particular classroom. If for some reason you purchase items that are not consumable in your child's class by mistake, we will return the unopened items to you. We will then ask that you supplement the class with items included on the teachers list.

The PEANUT-FREE School Zone is ALSO to include any snack items, party items, off-campus events and receptions that MMS families participate in as a school function. *If your child has an allergy, we* will provide you with an "ACTION PLAN" form that will need to be completed by your child's doctor. Food aversions will be accommodated on a case-by-case basis.

Parking Lot/ Carline & Elevator Safety

Safety in our parking lot is a major concern. Parents are responsible for their children as they are being brought to/from school and anytime a parent is with their child during the school day. While outside in the parking lot, the adult should hold the child by the hand so that the child cannot run out in front of or between cars.

Parking Lot & Carline Safety Tips

- Do not leave a child alone in a vehicle, not even because it's raining.
- Keep vehicles locked at all times.
- Teach children never to play, run or hide around a vehicle.
- Keep keys out of the child's reach.
- If you see a small child alone in a car, find the parent or contact any of the MMS Staff or Director.
- Never leave your car running unattended while in the parking lot...even in the winter months.
- DO NOT park in front of the HENRY BUILDING STEPS. (This is a fire lane and is a hazard to any and all people inside of the building or those that may be trying to access the stairs.)
- When in afternoon carline, do not park and leave your car.
- Do not walk up to the carline pick/up breezeway. Remain in your car. When it's your turn to load your child/we ask that you wait until then to get out to buckle your child in their car seat.
- We cannot release your child to you in carline if you do not have a car seat/booster.

Elevator Safety Tips

- Please do not allow your child to ride the elevator or run up the steps in a "race you" style.
- Do not send your child ahead of you or behind you- unattended on the steps or elevator.






